"...serve one another humbly in love." -Galatians 5: 13; 1 Peter 4: 10

Don't provoke and envy one another. -Galatians 5: 26

Carry one another's burdens. -Galatians 6: 2

"...be patient, bearing with one another in love." -Ephesians 4: 2; Colossians 3: 13

"Be kind and compassionate to one another..." -Ephesians 4: 32

Forgive one another. -Ephesians 4: 32; Colossians 3: 13

Don't lie to one another. -Colossians 3: 9

Encourage one another daily. -Hebrews 3: 13, 10: 24; 1 Thessalonians 4: 18, 5: 11

Don't slander one another. -James 4: 11

Don't grumble against one another. -James 5: 9

Confess sins to one another. -James 5: 16

Pray for one another. -James 5: 16

"Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling." -1 Peter 4: 9
